Homework Assignments:

- 2. Vector Silhouettes
 - Tools: Adobe Illustrator
 - Understand basics of vector images
 - Understand how to use Bezier curves and pen tool

Requirements:

- 1. Choose three digital photographs to create your silhouettes from
 - a. A person
 - b. A tree or plant
 - c. A building or vehicle
- 2. Create three separate Adobe Illustrator files.
- 3. Place one of the three images in each file (Go to File>Place to select and place your image file)
- 4. Lock the default layer that contains the image. Create a second layer on which to create your silhouette.
- 5. Use the pen tool in Illustrator to trace the outermost perimeter around your images (depending on the image you use, this might mean more than one shape; any holes or negative spaces need to be traced to "punch out" that space from the silhouette)
- 6. Hide the image layer
- 7. Convert any "holes" into a compound path and fill the resulting shape with color
- 8. Save each of your three Illustrator files using your initials and the subject (like this: pm_tree.ai)
- 9. Place your three Illustrator files AND your three image files into a folder labeled with your name and the word "silhouettes." (like this: phillip_motley_silhouettes)
- 10. Locate the folder and right click (on a laptop hold down control key and click) and choose "compress (name of your folder). Doing this will convert the folder into a Zip file. (it will end with .zip)
- 11. Place your Zip file on Quicksilver in the "Homework Submissions" folder (put your file in "Assignment 2", which is in our COM 220 class folder)
